PBL VALUES

Positive Behaviours for Learning

This year we have been working with the support of Melbourne
Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) to implement Positive Behaviours
for Learning (PBL) at St Monica's.

PBL is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour and helps schools develop safe and supportive learning environments. Explicitly teaching the expected behaviours and acknowledging students who display these positive behaviours is a major component of the PBL framework.

At St Monica's the first step in our PBL journey was identifying the core values we wanted to focus on as a school community. Earlier this term we invited all members of the school community (students, parents and teachers) to vote for the 3 core values.

We are pleased to announce that the school community has chosen the values of RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY AND RESILIENCE. Under the 'umbrella' of our three values are our Expected Behaviours for Learning that are explicitly taught across all year levels. We will share the Expected Behaviours for Learning matrix with you early in Term 2.

Whilst the values of kindness and safety were not chosen as our core values, kindness and safety will be represented in the Expected Behaviours for Learning matrix.

Our next step in our PBL journey is to gather student voices in branding our values. We look forward to tapping into the creativity of our students and we will share this with you in Term 2.

SCHOOL PHOTOS REMINDER

Online Ordering

SchoolPix has a secure online ordering system allowing parents to order and pay for their child's school and sibling's photos.

Parents simply visit www.schoolpix.com.au and click on the orange Order Online button.

A first-time user will need to create a new account. If parents have ordered from SchoolPix before, even from another school or preschool, they enter their email address and password to access their account.

They then enter the Job Number and Unique ID on each, child's personalised order flyer. Families with more than one child at your school can order for them all simultaneously by adding each child's unique codes.

Families can order online before photography day and up to 5 working days after photography. The exact date is shown when they login to order. Orders placed during this stage will receive free delivery back to the school.

Orders placed after the close date will incur a postage and handling fee, as the order will be delivered directly to their nominated address, not the school.

As all orders are placed online there is no need for families to return the order flyer to the school on photography day. CASH PAYMENTS ARE NO LONGER ACCEPTED.

Online payments can be made using PayPal or by VISA and MASTERCARD using our secure payment gateway. Please note that we do not accept AMEX or BPAY. There is no surcharge for ordering online.

Family Discount

Families with 3 or more children receive a 25% discount which applies to individual orders once a minimum spend of \$45 for each child is achieved. The discount is applied automatically at checkout.

If parents are eligible for a family discount they will also be entitled to a 25% discount on any sibling packages.

Ordering without a code

Parents can order online without a code before photography day using our "Student Search" feature. We require the school to provide us with the students' first and last names and date of birth. If it matches the information you provided, they can place an order. If not, they will have to request the code from you.

This feature is only available for orders placed before the Early Bird cut-off, around five days after photography. The order will be sent to the school for security reasons (including any issues with separated families).

The program is suitable for all students from Foundation - Year 6.


The cost is \$105 for 6 weeks.
