An important message from Senior Constable Daniel



At St Monica's, there are dedicated parking and drop-off areas, but these only work if we all follow the rules.

Parking signs are not just suggestions – they are there to protect our kids.

When we park in the wrong place, even "just for a minute":

- It can block the view for other drivers
- It can force kids to cross the road in unsafe spots
- It creates congestion that puts everyone at risk

Did you know?

- A child can't be seen by a driver if they are within 2 metres of the front or rear of a car. Illegal parking makes this worse.
- Stopping in No Stopping zones reduces visibility and creates blind spots.
- School speed zones are in place when kids are most at risk (8–9.30am and 2.30–4pm on school days).
- ✓ Double parking isn't just illegal it's dangerous. It forces children to walk between cars and increases the chance of an accident.

Here's how you can help keep our kids safe:

- ✓ Always follow the parking signs they are designed with children's safety in mind.
- ✓ Use the designated drop-off and pick-up areas these spots keep traffic
 moving and protect kids.
- ✓ Don't double park or stop in No Stopping zones it may seem quicker, but it creates danger for children crossing.
- ✓ Be patient and stay alert kids can be unpredictable near roads.
- By following these simple steps, we can work together to keep St Monica's a safe and happy place for every child.

An important message from Senior Constable Daniel



Tại Trường St Monica's, chúng tôi có những khu vực đậu xe và đón/trả học sinh riêng biệt, nhưng những khu vực này chỉ phát huy hiệu quả khi tất cả chúng ta tuân thủ đúng quy định.

Biển báo đậu xe không chỉ là gợi ý – chúng được đặt ra để bảo vệ sự an toàn của con em chúng ta.

Khi chúng ta đậu xe sai chỗ, dù chỉ "một phút":

- Có thể che khuất tầm nhìn của các tài xế khác
- Có thể buộc trẻ em phải băng qua đường ở những vị trí không an toàn
- Gây ra tình trạng ùn tắc, khiến mọi người gặp nguy hiểm
 Ban có biết không?
- ☑ Trẻ em không thể được tài xế nhìn thấy nếu chúng đứng trong vòng 2 mét trước hoặc sau xe. Đậu xe sai quy định làm cho tình trạng này nghiêm trọng hơn.
 - Dừng xe ở khu vực cấm dừng làm giảm tầm nhìn và tạo ra điểm mù.
- Giới hạn tốc độ trong khu vực trường học được áp dụng vào những thời điểm trẻ em có nguy cơ cao nhất

(8:00-9:30 sáng và 2:30-4:00 chiều các ngày đi học).

Đậu xe hai hàng không chỉ là phạm luật – mà còn cực kỳ nguy hiểm. Nó buộc trẻ em phải đi giữa các xe, làm tăng nguy cơ tai nạn.

Đây là cách bạn có thể giúp giữ an toàn cho con em chúng ta:

- ✓ Luôn tuân thủ các biển báo đậu xe chúng được thiết kế vì sự an toàn của trẻ em.
- ✓ Sử dụng đúng khu vực đón và trả học sinh những vị trí này giúp giao thông thông suốt và bảo vệ trẻ em.
- √ Không đậu xe hai hàng hoặc dừng ở khu vực cấm dừng có thể nhanh hơn, nhưng tạo ra nguy hiểm cho trẻ khi băng qua đường.
- ✓ Hãy kiên nhẫn và tập trung quan sát trẻ em có thể bất ngờ chạy ra đường. Bằng cách làm theo những bước đơn giản này, chúng ta có thể cùng nhau giữ cho St Monica's là một nơi an toàn và vui vẻ cho tất cả trẻ em.

2. Please do not park in front of the "KEEP CLEAR" area, this is for the safety of all students.



Wingfield St, on the school side, is a 5 minute parking area only.
Please do not park and leave your car.

This space is for dropping off students.



4. When parking along the side of the road, students should exit from the left hand side of the car only (they should not go on the roadside).



5. If you park in the median car park, exit the car on the left hand side.

A family member must walk their child/student to the school side footpath.

If you park on Conway's side of





the road, make your way to the zebra crossings at either end of Wingfield St and cross with a family member.







7. Young students should be holding a family member's hands when crossing the road.

"Children under 10 have underdeveloped peripheral vision, which makes it difficult for them to see and react to hazards in their surroundings, particularly vehicles, when crossing roads"



Why do I need a roll pass?

If you come to school after the bell, you need to stop at the office to get a late pass.

This helps us:

- Know you're here So we don't worry about you.
- Tell your teacher, the pass shows your teacher you've checked in.Keep track, we write down who is late so our records are right.

So if you're late, that's okay, just come to the office first and get your roll pass.






